
Please note that the above has been repatriated to Japan. At the time of repatriation, the following transactions took place:





Chattels:

The above Japanese person did not declare any chattels but a review of his file reveals two lots of chattels sold at auction, namely Vancouver Auction 41 on February 28, 1945, and Vancouver Auction 42 on March 14, 1945. There was some uncertainty as to the ownership of these chattels and the funds in the total amount of \$29.26 were held pending further investigation. It was later confirmed by Mr. Spain that the above goods were the property of Mr. Seikichi Nishikawa and the proceeds therefrom are held to his credit with the Custodian.
