
Please note that the above Japanese has been repatriated to Japan. The following is the status of his account with this Department, covering the repatriation transactions:

In a letter to us dated April 23, 1943 the above Japanese person stated he had lost the three copies of the JP form but declared that his only "personal belongings" in the Protected Area was a \$1000.00 Sun Life Insurance policy, same being in his possession. This file reveals that the above policy at no time came under the control of the Custodian, and no other assets of any kind are shown on the file.

No claims against the above Japanese person are revealed on this file, and same is now being closed.





MEMORANDUM

June 13th, 1946

TO: Mr. Good
FROM: Mrs. Robertson

Re: Sahichi FURUHASHI - #01440 - File 13917
"Vanderhoof Addition #1"

Kazo FURUHASHI, father of the above Evacuee, held a one-quarter interest in the real property known as 874 West 6th Avenue, Vancouver, and there is no trace on either the father's or son's file that the father's interest was transferred to Sahichi Furuhashi's name. This property was sold in September 1945 and one-quarter of the proceeds derived from the sale were credited to Kazo FURUHASHI'S account, Int. 321.

According to your memo Sahichi Furuhashi now declares he left 1 Tool Box and 1 Bicycle "at the house next door east to 847 N. 7th Avenue in the name of Kozai." On looking through Kozai's file, No. 3895, there is no trace of a bicycle or tool box, although a "box of tools" was declared by Kozai as being his own property.

On April 23rd, 1943, S. Furuhashi wrote to the Custodian stating "I have no personal belongings in the protected area". Tracing the address next to 847 N. 7th Avenue, however, it is noted that 837 N. 7th Avenue has been continuously occupied by Mrs. Funnell who was approached in 1943 and stated that she had no knowledge of any Japanese personal property said to have been left at that address.
