This is to advise you that we have received reply from KAMACHI regarding your claim, as above, against him. He states that it should be \$339.39, which is very close to the amount that you claim. He also states that he cannot settle same at this time. We are quoting from his letter as follows:

The claim should be \$339.39, I have made arrangement with Mr. Sate before the evacuation that soon as the naval department sells my boat I would pay him the money. Thats the reason why I never reported to the Gustodian. But when the naval department sold my boat I only got t of the money I expected, which was the sum of only \$150. So that made it impossible for me to pay him back the money. That \$150 was just enough to pay for half of the expenses for our transportation when we were evacuating.

"It is impossible for me to pay him the money now since we cannot continue our former business. And cannot make a of the money I used too.
