Bank Accounts: None.


Life Insurance: This evacuee owned a Sun Life policy (no amount given), which did not come under the administration of this office.



Dear Sir,

Under instructions of Mr. P. H. Gardner of your Department in Ottawa, we are enclosing two cheques representing the proceeds of War Savings Certificates sent to us for redemption registered in the names of Japanese and comment as follows:

Cheque COL3651 dated August 21, 1945, for \$8.50 in favour of Shiehisuke Yamamoto.

This cheque was returned to us by the Department of Labour, Japanese Division, Vancouver, under cover of their letter dated 7 November 1945 which stated that Yamamoto left Canada for Japan in November 1941 and that his wife and children are also in Japan.

It would appear, therefore, that the certificates were forwarded to us by a person other than the registered owner.

Cheque COL2023 dated July 6, 1945, for \$4.31 in favour of Masuitsu Kimura.

This cheque was returned to us by the Post Office Department as undeliverable.

The relative certificate was applied for through The Royal Bank of Canada, Prince Rupert, B. C., who advise us that the present whereabouts of the payee are unknown to them.

Your file has been up for review and we give below a brief resume of contents thereof.

On the 17th March, 1943, you signed a Custodian card stating that you had no property of any kind in the protected area of British Columbia.

Bonds, Shares, etc.: The Registrar of War Savings Certificates sent in to this office, for the credit of your account, the sum of \$4.31, representing redemption value of a War Savings Certificate sent in to him in your name.

Life Insurance: You appear to have been the owner of a Sun Life policy, which, however, remained in your possession and did not come under our administration.

Liabilities: On May 13/44 we advised you of a claim for \$434.29 filed against you by Mrs. Shimo KAMEDA (File 1582) of Port Essington. We cannot trace having received any reply from you and we would be obliged if you would confirm this liability, if correct, or supply us with the information needed to correct our records, if incorrect.

Funds: There is a balance of \$4.31 standing at the credit of your account, which we desire to close. We would therefore suggest that you authorize us to remit this money to Mrs. Shimo KAMEDA if her claim against you is correct.

We enclose a stamped addressed envelope for your convenience and would appreciate a prompt acknowledgment of this letter.
