
Please note that the above has been repatriated to Japan. At the time of repatriation, the following transactions took place:


This Japanese person did not make a declaration and on May 7th, 1943 admitted that his wife, Riyou, file 7868, had registered their possessions with the Custodian.

The Provincial Collector refunded \$5.73 to the Custodian on behalf of Toki, representing 1% Wage Deductions for 1941, and this was credited to his account.

Two claims were registered with the Custodian against Shinji TOKI - Royal Columbian Hospital, New Westminster - \$19.75, Dr. R.C. Purvis, New Westminster - \$35.00. The amount of \$5.73 remaining at the credit of Shinji TOKI was paid to Royal Columbian Hospital on September 14th, 1944.

This file requires no further administration and can be closed.

This office has a credit in his favour of \$5.73. Therefore, if your Representative could persuade him to send us \$14.02 we could be glad to settle this claim on his behalf.

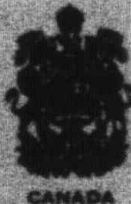
