We have your letter of the 22nd inst. in reply to ours of the 19th inst. relative to the above claim, denying same.

Before reporting to IZUKAWA what you say we wish to inform you that IZUKAWA formerly owned or operated a store by the name of "Seishindo", at 247 Powell Street, Vancouver, and it may be that you traded with that store. You state:

"I have no memory borrowing money from Mr. Isukawa."

Our letter does not say that you borrowed any money from him, but that someone by your name, formerly at 423 West 2nd Avenue, Vancouver, owes IZUKAWA the above amount.

Please think this over again and let us have further reply by return mail.
