As Fukumoto made no declaration to the Custodian, we have no knowledge of his assets other than a few personal effects reported to us by the B. C. Security Commission which we advised them to sell and apply the proceeds against their claim for funeral expenses.

Mr. Fukumoto did not register his assets with the Custodian and we have no record of his assets, if any, save and except the personal effects you have tabulated.

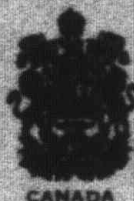
After you have finished sale would you please let us hear as to sales proceeds obtained by you.

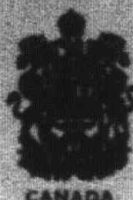
