GENERAL SUMMARY

RE: Ichio or Kaguo BANDO, Reg. No. 11646

Mr. BANDO was evacuated on March 20/42. He never made a declaration to the Custodian although he was sent copies of J.P. forms to fill out. At a later date we sent him a yellow "No property" card which we asked him to fill out if he had no property left in the protected area, but he never returned this.

He was evacuated to "c/o R.C.M.P. Detachment, Vernon, B.C. and on checking with the R.C.M.P. they advise he is now at Revelstoke, B.C.


His account has been credited with the sum of \$20.00, representing arrears of wages owing to him by the Canada Daily News. Since he was a printer by trade, it seems reasonable to suppose that he is the correct person. This is his only credit with the Custodian.

There are no claims on his file and none on the file of his wife, File 14825.

The above summary is certified to be in accordance with the information on file.
