PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: Yasuhei TAKASHIMA, Reg. No. 11030.

Y. TAKASHIMA was evacuated on July 4, 1942 and signed a declaration to the Custodian on June 17th, 1943, from Greenwood.

CHATELS : He declared one trunk, 1 can of rice, 5 wooden boxes, 1 sack of rice and 1 washtub containing miscellaneous articles. The trunk, 2 wooden boxes and the washtub of miscellaneous articles were sold by auction for the net sum of \$18.32. A salmon box and 2 wooden boxes as well as the sack and can of rice have not been accounted for. They may have been discarded or may have been shipped to the Japanese.

FISHING

NETS:

The Canadian Fishing Company sold a Coho net belonging to Y. TAKASHIMA, for the net sum of \$30.00. Yasuhei TAKASHIMA was identified as the owner and the money was paid to him on July 6, 1943.

INCOME

TAX

Income Tax Form T4-1942 was received from the Canadian Fishing Co. in the name of K. TAKASHIMA. This was identified as belonging to Yasuhei TAKASHIMA but was not sent to him as he was given the required information by letter.

This file reveals no other property.

CHATTEL SUMMARY

Re: TAKASHIMA, Yasuhei - Reg. No. 11030.

Yasuhei TAKASHIMA declared on June 17, 1943 that he had left 1 Trunk, 1 Can of rice, 5 Wooden boxes, 1 Sack of rice and 1 Washtub containing misc. articles, all stored at the Carlisle Cannery.

Previous to his declaration, Mr. Smith of the Custodian's Office took an inventory of the chattels left at Carlisle, April, 1942 and Mr. Salter, Manager of the Cannery also took an inventory of the chattels left at the Cannery on October 10, 1942.

On October 7, 1943, all the goods from the Carlisle Cannery were shipped to Vancouver and stored at 992 Powell St.; Inventory No. 442. One wooden box and one salmon box which appeared on Mr. Salter's inventory were not included and it is presumed that they contained dried fish or some other foodstuff which had deteriorated. All the chattels brought from Carlisle were sold, the trunk on March 29, 1946 and the other goods on January 18, 1945, the net total proceeds being \$18.32. The can and sack of rice and two wooden boxes which were declared by I. TAKASHIMA never appeared on any inventory and we can only presume that the rice, as in so many cases, deteriorated. The boxes may also have contained foodstuffs which would have to be discarded. It is also possible that they may have been shipped to the Japanese between June 17 and October 7, 1943, dates at which he declared and shipment to Vancouver was made.

Inventory 682, dated January 14, 1945, lists one trunk and one box. Information received from Mr. Wills discloses that when goods were being sorted for Auction Vancouver 38, January 18, 1945, the trunk and box were kept aside as being personal goods and a new inventory made up. A change of policy resulted in the trunk being sold and the contents being clothing were given to the Welfare for shipment to Japan. The box contained miscellaneous books and papers and was discarded on December 7, 1945.

A trunk belonging to Kenzo MORI, File 14340 was sold in Vancouver 56 and credited to this file in error. It has been transferred to the rightful owner.
