GENERAL SUMMARY

INATA, Takamitsu (Mr.)  
Reg. No. 03563

Mr. INATA was a tailor. His establishment was known as the Victoria Dye Works, 632 Victoria Ave. It was a building rented from Mr. Penn, 571 Richards Street. It would seem that Mr. Philip Penn was referred to as Mr. Paine in File 9046, INATA, Yama (Mrs. Takamitsu). Mr. INATA was evacuated March 31, 1942. His declaration to the Custodian was made June 27, 1943.

**LIABILITIES:** The M. Furuya Company, Limited, file #669, claim \$30.00, April 30, 1942. We made an attempt June 12, 1944 and July 19, 1944, to collect this amount from Mr. INATA, as we had no funds belonging to him. On September 6th, 1944 we gave his address to Messrs. M. Furuya Company, c/o Messrs. P. S. Ross & Sons, Royal Bank Bldg., Vancouver. This file reveals no other liabilities of any kind.

**PERSONAL PROPERTY:** Mr. INATA listed a two piece cupboard, 1 double bed, spring and bedposts, 1 baby bed, spring, bedposts and mattress, 1 bureau, containing iron, tools and clothing, 4 boxes containing hangers, books, china and kitchen utensils. These chattels were left at 610 Victoria Drive. According to File 9046, INATA, Yama, (Mrs. Takamitsu) October 21st, 1942, 610 Victoria Drive was rented by Mrs. Patterson from Mr. Penn, 571 Richards Street, Vancouver. On October 22, 1942, File 9046, Mr. Penn advised that 1 bed and spring, 1 bureau and 1 kitchen cabinet (probably the two piece cupboard) had been left in his care.

On October 4, 1943, one cardboard box containing books, bedding and all materials in the bureau (clothes and 5 cushions) were located at 610 Victoria Drive and shipped to INATA at Slocan City. He acknowledged receipt on December 8, 1943. It would seem that a cabinet, 1 double bed and spring, 1 baby bed, mattress and spring, 1 bureau - minus the contents, and 3 boxes containing hangers, china and kitchen utensils, are still at 610 Victoria Drive.

This file reveals no other properties of any kind.

This summary is certified to be in accordance with the information on hand.

Dear Madam:

On receipt of your letter of November 3, 1947, we examined your file, and we found that on May 14, 1942, you reported that your possessions were 3 beds, one dining room set, one bookcase, one table, one heater, one sofa, one Singer sewing machine and one Taylor sewing machine. You stated that you would try to sell these goods prior to your evacuation. On May 22, 1942, you reported that your furniture had been moved to 610 Victoria Drive, an empty house owned by Mr. Paine, and that the key to the house was in the possession of Mr. Paine.

Upon investigation it was found that the person in whose care your goods were left was Mr. Philip Penn, 571 Richards Street, Vancouver. Mr. Penn acknowledged holding for you one kitchen cabinet, one chest of drawers and one bed and spring. Our records do not indicate the disposition of the other articles declared by you.

According to our records, one carton of books, five cushions and some clothes were shipped to your husband in December, 1943. These goods appear to be the contents of the bureau or chest of drawers left in the care of Mr. Penn, and were requested by Mr. Ivata on October 4, 1943.

Apart from the shipment made to Mr. Ivata, our records do not show any change in the arrangements you made with Mr. Penn for the storage of your goods.
