"I mentioned to you on several occasions the two floats lying in Reifel's Slough belonging to K. Teraguchi, one float 75' x 12', and the other 50' x 12'. These floats are not in very good shape and will require certain repairs. For the two floats we are prepared to pay you a rental of \$15.00 per year, or on a purchase basis, pay you the sum of \$50.00 for the two floats. Thanking you for your consideration in the above."
