Dear Sirs:

From time to time you have been advised in regard to the administration of your affairs and as this is now being completed, it is felt you will appreciate being supplied with a brief summary.

On evacuation from the protected area, you failed to make any declaration to the Custodian and when a form was sent to you, you declared on May 10, 1943 that you had no property left in the protected area. However, you wrote us on the same date stating that your son, Sachiro OZAKI, registered personal property belonging to you. As your son did not declare any property until some time after your evacuation, the Custodian did not have an opportunity to protect your chattels, therefore, no responsibility can be taken by the Custodian for the loss of your goods.

Also, you omitted to declare two fishing vessels which were sold by the Japanese Fishing Vessel Disposal Committee. You received the amount of \$4,451.50 for the vessel, "OZAKI #2" and for the vessel, "B. O." was paid to you per U. SAKAMOTO, attorney, the sum of \$393.50.

With reference to the shares in the Yorkshire Savings & Loan Association, it was found that these shares were registered in the joint names of your son and yourself in the amount of \$334.27. In a letter dated December 15, 1943, your son requested that payment be made on the proceeds of his Sun Life Assurance Policy Nos. 2-56460 and 2191015. This payment was made from the joint account and the transfer of the funds approved by you on January 16, 1946. Ninety-nine cents, a portion of the enclosed cheque will complete the equal payment of the joint account between yourself and your son.

Also, \$3.00, the other portion of the enclosed cheque, had been credited to your account from the B. C. Electric Railway Company, Ltd., for security deposit for light.

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We are attaching herewith a statement of your account and it would appear that we have accounted for all the property of any kind declared by you in the protected area which was vested in the Custodian. In order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the enclosed cheque in the amount of \$3.99, a stamped self-addressed envelope is enclosed for your convenience in replying.
