SET FOR

1. The above named is at present in custody at the Canadian Immigration Detention Shed in this city having been arrested as an alien enemy. He is 31 years old and is occupied as a farmer on Mayne Island in B.C. On Dec. 12th, 1941 the writer interviewed this man in an effort to obtain information which might prove of assistance to the custodian of enemy alien property in the administration of his affairs.

2. This man is married and has three small children. His wife is Joan Minamide. He married into his wife's family and in keeping with a Japanese custom he took his wife's name. He has no land or real property of any kind as this is all in his fath-in-law's name, Mesajiro Minamide of Mayne Island.

3. He has no safety deposit box but has an account with the East End Branch of the Bank of Montreal in Vancouver with a balance of about \$300. He carries no insurance but has a \$50. Victory Bond at home which is fully paid. His wife, Joan Minamide, prior to her marriage had a \$1000. life insurance policy with the Sun Life which is still in effect.

4. Minamide claims to be free from debt and that he has no income from any source other than his farming operations. He lives with his wifes family on Mayne Island. An effort will be made at a later date to verify the information contained above with the cooperation of the local representative of the custodian of enemy alien property.



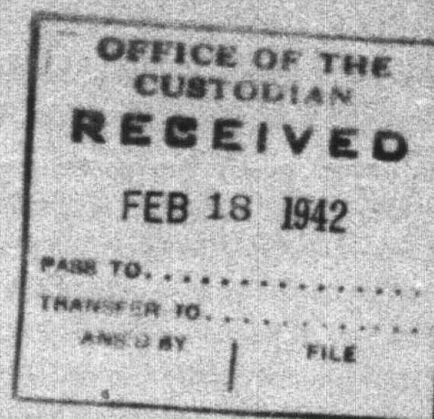

The above-named was admitted to the Provincial Mental Hospital at Essondale, B.C., on January 30th, 1942, from Mayne Island, and during his stay there the Attorney-General, for whom this office is acting, is statutory committee of his estate and authorized to deal with his affairs under the "Lunacy Act."

I understand the patient has an account at the Bank of Montreal, Main and Hastings Streets Branch, Vancouver, B.C., with the sum of \$301.33 at his credit in their Savings Department, and that this account is under your control. I would be glad if you would kindly advise me if it would be possible for you to release these funds to the Attorney-General and make them available for the maintenance of the patient while in the Hospital. Should this man later be released from Hospital any balance of funds would of course be returned to the Bank subject to your control as heretofore.

As an alternative I would suggest that a quarterly statement of the hospital charges, which will be at the rate of one dollar per day, could be submitted to you and paid out of the account.

In this connection I wish to advise that the Bank of Montreal, Main and Hastings Streets branch, Vancouver, reported the sum of \$301.33 held at the credit of the above noted internee. \$50.00 of this amount was released to Mrs. Minamide on the 13th inst. upon receipt of information to the effect that she was without funds.
