These articles were of insufficient value to justify the expense of moving to Custodian warehouse. They were allowed to remain in the garden at this address.

SPECIFIED ARTICLES: A radio surrendered by the above to the R.C.M.P., was turned over by them to the Custodian on June 16/44, and sold at auction for the net sum of \$38.07, and this amount credited to his account.

LIFE INSURANCE: The above declared a life insurance policy with the Montreal Life Insurance. No details were given. This did not come under the control of the Custodian.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.

SUPPLEMENTARY SUMMARY

April 11, 1947.

On April 1, 1946 the balance standing to the credit of Yoshinaga TAKAHASHI was sent to him. He acknowledged receipt of this but asked on behalf of his wife, Chizuko, File 10486, for information regarding chattels which she had declared as having left at 414 West 6th. Ave. These chattels were found to have been mixed with those of Yoshimi Henry TAKAHASHI, File 12621, brother of Yoshinaga. Before the question of the chattels was settled, Henry Yoshimi TAKAHASHI returned to Japan. Mrs. Chizuko was asked to select from the auction sheets the items which belonged to her and make a statutory declaration to that effect. This was done and the net sum of \$63.93 transferred to her account. She asked for information regarding two silver trophy cups. These cannot be located nor is there any record of their being moved to the Warehouse.

A list of chattels was declared by Mrs. Yoshimi Takahashi in her JP form as having been left at 414 West 6th Avenue, Vancouver, B. C. This list, however, was superseded by that enclosed by Mr. Yoshimi Takahashi with his letter dated November 18, 1942, at which time he stated that some of the goods declared by Mrs. Yoshimi Takahashi had been disposed of. Chattels have therefore been dealt with on the husband's file, number 12621.

On January 3, 1944 goods were moved from 414 W. 6th Avenue and sold at Vancouver Auction No. 9 on January 20, 1944. Additional goods were sold at Vancouver auctions 10 and 57 held on February 9/10, 1944 and December 14, 1945, respectively. The proceeds from the sale of all chattels removed from the above address were credited to Yoshimi Takahashi's account, although it was later revealed that a brother, Yoshinaga Takahashi, had left chattels at this address.

Mrs. Yoshinaga Takahashi declared in her JP form dated June 8, 1946 goods as having been left at 414 W. 6th Avenue and in a letter dated April 14, 1946, the husband, Yoshinaga Takahashi, listed on behalf of his wife the chattels left at these premises and asked for information regarding them. On April 20, 1946, Mr. Spaul advised Yoshinaga that due to lack of identification marks all goods were removed and sold under Yoshimi Takahashi's name and the funds credited to Yoshimi's account. He stated, however, that at Yoshimi's request we would forward the auction sheets that they might get together and examine them and separate the articles. No reply was received to our letter and Yoshimi Takahashi was repatriated to Japan on August 2nd, 1946, leaving the matter of chattels unsettled.

The proceeds from the sale of chattels ~~Yoshinaga Takahashi~~ are being held in Yoshimi Takahashi's account pending correct distribution.

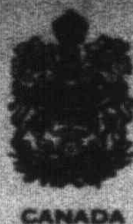

Your file has been reviewed and the following is noted.

When you made your declaration to the Custodian on November 1st, 1942, you declared seventy five earthen flower pots and three cold frame windows, at 414 West 6th Avenue, Vancouver. These articles were of insufficient value to justify the expense of moving them to the Custodian warehouse, and were allowed to remain where you had left them.

The General Electric radio which you surrendered to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police on March 9th, 1942, was turned over by them to the Custodian on June 20th, 1944, and sold at auction for the net sum of \$38.07, and we now enclose Custodian cheque in this amount.

You declared a life insurance policy with the Montreal Life Insurance Company, but did not supply us with any details of this policy. This did not come under the control of the Custodian.

Dear Sir:

Please refer to our letter to you of April 20, 1946 in connection with chattels declared by your wife, Chisuko TAKAHASHI, which she claimed were left at the house of your brother, Yoshimi Takahashi, at 414 West 6th Avenue, Vancouver, B. C., and later removed with goods belonging to your wife and sold at public auction. The proceeds from the sale of these goods were credited to Yoshimi Takahashi's account and we now wish to ascertain correct ownership of the items sold and transfer to your wife's account the funds derived from the sale of goods which belonged to her.

We are enclosing herewith the auction sheets in connection with the above-mentioned goods and would ask you to have your wife examine them carefully and write her name opposite each item which belonged to her. We would then ask you to have her list the goods which she checked on the auction sheets as belonging to her, on the attached Statutory Declaration, sign it before a Notary Public in and for the Province of Quebec, and return the original to this office together with the auction sheets on which she has checked the items belonging to her.

You might also advise us at the same time whether unidentifiable items are of little or no value and would not justify further shipping charges.
