Thank you for your letter of October 7th, in regard to your radio.

This radio has been sold for the net sum of \$24.71, which has been credited to your account. If you will send us the receipt given to you when the radio was surrendered, we will send you the money.

Your camera is in our hands, and may be shipped to you if you wish to have it. If you will send us the receipt for the camera, along with your instructions for shipment, we will have the camera sent to you by registered mail. The cost of mailing would be charged to your account with us. The cost would be less than \$1.00. The balance of the \$24.71 would then be sent to you.

We ask for the receipt in order to prevent the shipment of radios or cameras, or the remittance of money received from the sale of these articles, to persons other than the owners.

The request of Mr. Tanaka for the return of his camera has been passed on to this office by the British Columbia Security Commission.

While we have no record of a camera belonging to Mr. Tanaka, we have in our possession a camera which was surrendered to the police by Mrs. Tanaka. This is probably the camera referred to in Mr. Tanaka's letter.

As we informed Mrs. Tanaka in our letter of October 14th, it is necessary that you send us the receipt, given to you by the police, before we can send the camera to you.

If you will send us the receipt for the radio and camera, we will have the camera mailed to you, and will send you the balance of the radio money.

In accordance with your request of July 3rd, we enclose herewith our cheque in the amount of \$24.63, payable to you.

Your camera was sent to you by insured parcel post on July 10th, and should be in your hands by the time you receive this letter. If the camera has not been received, please let us know.

While you did not register with the Custodian, although requested to do so on four occasions, and did not formally declare any property remaining in the Protected Area, it was reported to this office by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police that you were the owner of the radio and camera mentioned above. This has been confirmed by the RCMP receipt which you sent to us on July 3rd.

The property of your husband is handled on a separate file. A report of his affairs will be sent to him in due course.

A statement of your account is attached. From this you will note that no funds remain to your credit in this office.

It would appear that we have accounted for all property of any kind left by you in the Protected Area which vested in the Custodian. In order that you may confirm this, and acknowledge receipt of the enclosed cheque and of the camera which has been mailed to you, we are enclosing a stamped, self-addressed envelope.
