

MEMORANDUM

TO: MR. G. PETERS
FROM: MR. W. J. JOHNSTON
RE: P/W 1-420, IWAMOTO, Kinji,
and Hisao TSURUDA

Regarding the Barber Shop Equipment, which Mrs. Chiyo (Kinji) Iwamoto claims was left at 609 Hastings Street East, we wish to advise you that her husband's file, Internee 577, shows that he did not declare any such equipment as being owned by him.

However, he did declare that the sum of \$120.00 was owed to him by Hisao Tsuruda, 705 East Cordova Street, Vancouver, B.C. We wrote Mr. Tsuruda regarding this claim and he replied as follows:

"Regarding Mr. K. Iwamoto's claim for \$120.00, I am launching a counter-claim. Mr. K. Iwamoto and I as partners started a barber and bath house which cost \$1,200.00. This venture ended in bankruptcy and I shouldered most of the loss. As partner, Mr. Iwamoto should have shouldered \$600.00 but I received only \$120.00; consequently I should receive \$480.00".

We communicated with the Internee, Kinji Iwamoto, regarding the above and he replied as follows:

"I wish to state that we will settle the matter after the end of the War by ourselves, as a very complicated matter is in it in connection with this transaction".

Hisao Tsuruda's file, including his JP Form, makes no reference to Barber Shop Equipment, and we therefore presume that in the course of the bankruptcy proceedings any Barber Shop Equipment, which was in their possession at one time, must have been seized on behalf of the Vendors.
