The signature of G. KANO resembles that of Takatsugi KANO, son of the deceased, File 5038.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.

Re: Gensaku KARINO

Reference is made to your claim of \$3.93 regarding Gensaku Karino whom we have not been able to identify, and to letter dated December 10th from Messrs. P. S. Ross & Sons giving 'in care of Celtic Cannery, Eburne, B. C.,' as the last known address of Mr. Gensaku Karino.

The superintendent of the Celtic Shipyards of the B. C. Packers, Ltd. states that Mr. Gensaku Karino is not known to them and did not work for them.

The assistant bookkeeper of the Imperial Cannery of the B. C. Packers, Ltd. in Steveston states that the name is also not known to them.

In view of the small amount of the claim involved, and in view of the fact that, as already stated, Mr. Gensaku Karino is not registered with the Custodian, is not known to the Custodian, and does not appear in the files of the RCMP, we are closing our files as we do not think that we are warranted in this case in spending further time and money in canvassing the Phoenix Cannery, the A. B. C. Packing Company, the Gulf of Georgia Cannery, the Canadian Fishing Company, and the Great West Packing Company, all of Steveston.

If Messrs. M. Furuya Company, Ltd. desire us to take further action, we must ask for sufficient information to enable us to identify the individual mentioned.

We have already indicated that the last transaction
involved was dated December 12, 1941, although we note that
the sworn affidavit of Mr. Ukou Hignight gives this man's ad-
dress as 12730 Granville Street, Vancouver.
