S. OKABE, believed to be Sakume OKABE, was reported in March, 1942, as having enquired about a 3.5 HP Johnson. Sakuma OKABE did not declare ownership to Custodian, and did not reply to our letter, 18/5/43. Apart from reported enquiry of S. OKABE there is nothing to connect this man with this engine.

It is possible that Toshio KIMURA returned to Japan and left his boat and engine in the care of Sakuma OKABE.
