

On November 18th, as you will remember, we sent to the Prudential Life Insurance Company a cheque for \$60.00 from your account in this office as payment on premiums of the above policies. This was done in accordance with your request and an order signed by yourself dated August 13, 1943, which had been forwarded to us by the B.C. Security Commission. In this order you directed that an amount of \$66.10 be paid.

At that time \$60.00 was all that could be spared from the account for this purpose. On January 4th we sent a further sum of \$35.00 to be applied on the same premium, making a total of \$95.00 which has been sent from this office to the Prudential Insurance Company for your account.

We have a letter from the Prudential Insurance Company dated January 10th. This letter, apparently, was written from their head office who at that time knew nothing of the \$35.00 that we had sent on January 4th because, as you will notice from the copy of letter supplied to you by the Insurance Company, they only mention \$60.00 having been sent from here.

As you will notice in the copy of Prudential's letter of January 10th, they refer to all of the policies listed above, whereas in our letters to them of November 18th and January 4th we only referred to four policies as per your original request.

According to the Prudential Life, should you wish all of the policies mentioned in their letter brought up-to-date, it will be necessary to complete the reinstatement forms with which they have supplied you, and it will also be necessary to remit to the Insurance Company an additional amount of \$128.57, which is the \$163.57 mentioned on Page 2 of their letter less the \$35.00 sent to them on January 4th. That is, of course, providing you wish to continue the policies on the annual plan.

I am advised that today your account in this office has a credit balance of \$102.98 and if you wish to reinstate the policy and pay them up on the annual date as mentioned above, it would be necessary for you to remit sufficient to make up the \$126.97 required. If, on the other hand, you decide to have them reinstated and pay other than the annual premium, the amount required as stated above, being \$36.48, could be paid from your account here. We will be unable to do anything further in this matter until we hear from you.

If, on the other hand, you do not wish to continue the annual plan, they state that the amount required to reinstate the policy to the end of January, 1944, would be \$26.48 which is arrived at by deducting the payment of \$35.00. This is referred to in the 9th paragraph of their letter.
