



PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: Takeo NAKAMURA, Reg. No. 06546

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on September 14, 1943. He had been evacuated on March 16, 1942. He was repatriated August 2, 1946.

In his declaration NAKAMURA reported a 3 piece bedroom suite, a Japanese costume in one of the drawers, and 2 cartons containing Japanese festival dolls, all stored at Storey & Campbell warehouse. Following the repatriation of NAKAMURA, the Custodian took possession of these chattels and sold them at auction on August 29, 1946, for the net sum of \$84.47, which has been credited to the account of Takeo NAKAMURA.

Dear Mr. Maruno:

Replying to your letter of July 16th, we wish to advise that apparently there has been some misunderstanding as we have the goods you mentioned stored in our warehouse. It is not possible for us to send these goods to you without receiving permission of the official Custodian.

The Custodian informs me that it will be necessary for application to be made by Mr. Nakamura to the Department of Labour, Japanese Division, Lemon Creek, and through this office, obtain a release which will be forwarded to Storey & Campbell, and on receipt of this we will be able to ship the wanted articles to you.

Incidentally, we have the bedroom suite etc. listed as the property of "Mrs. M. Nakamura, 733 Powell Street, Vancouver, B. C."

With regard to the Tailor Sewing Machine, the situation is as recently advised; namely, we cannot obtain one of these for you for delivery under three or four months.

We would be pleased to promptly despatch your goods as soon as the proper authorization is received here.

NAKANURA is on the list of repatriates and his balance has been given to Mr. Good. This balance is \$12.97 but it is not free, as there is an account of \$50.00 owing to the B.C.S.C. for funeral expenses in connection with funeral of Natsuo NAKANURA, a son of the above.

I have advised Mr. Story to instruct NAKANURA to apply to the Dept. of Labour for the customary Custodian Release for shipment of these goods.

Attached, for your information, is a copy of letter received by Mr. Nakamura from the Custodian's office. It would appear that the Custodian Department is correct in the statement that Storey & Campbell have no record of the transaction in the name of Mr. Nakamura.

Apparently, the facts in reference to this transaction are as under:

The furniture in question is the property of Mr. Nakamura but was stored in the name of Mr. Satoshi Maruno, in whose name it would appear the storage contract was issued, as the articles in question are already stored in the name of Mr. Maruno, but appear to be the property of Mrs. Nakamura.

We are enclosing herewith, a letter signed by Mr. Nakamura authorizing Mr. Maruno to deal with these articles as he sees fit.

It has been explained that as Mr. Maruno is going back to Japan on the next boat, we do not consider it advisable to have this shipment made to this point and have him incur freight charges on the same.
