

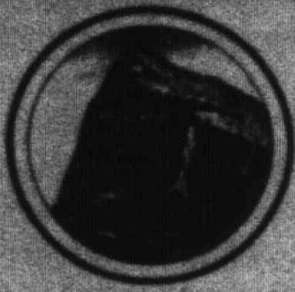

Your cooperation will be appreciated.

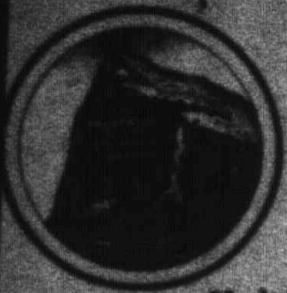

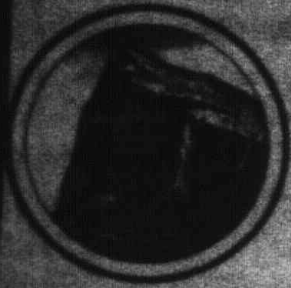
