Monies owing to Evacuee:

Although the above Japanese person did not declare any monies owing to him in his JP form dated October 4th, 1943, he informed us on February 21st, 1944, that he had loaned \$75.00 to Gentaro Nagata, New Denver, of which \$32.00 had been repaid, leaving a balance owing of \$43.00. We wrote to Kanjuro Nagata, New Denver, in connection with this debt as the name of Gentaro Nagata does not appear in our files. On March 18, 1944, Uemura confirmed that Kanjuro was the correct name, not Gentaro. However, we received no replies to our letters to Kanjuro Nagata, and on March 28, 1944 we advised Uemura to get in touch with Kanjuro direct. We received a letter from Uemura on May 5/44 in which he informed us he had written two letters to Mr. Nagata but had not received a reply. We then wrote to the New Denver Supervisor and in the report from the Department of Labour we were informed that Nagata stated he did not recollect having borrowed or become indebted to the above-mentioned man for the above amount. We advised Uemura accordingly and told him we would take no further action in the matter but would leave the claim to be arranged between them.

Bonds:

Two Victory Bonds, one for \$100.00 and one for \$50.00, were declared by the above Japanese person in his JP form dated October 4th, 1943, and held for safekeeping at this office. These bonds were forwarded to Uemura at Toronto, on September 22nd, 1943.

Bank Account:

Bank passbook No. 2556, Royal Bank of Canada, Cambie & Broadway Branch, Vancouver, was handed over to the Custodian. This passbook showed a credit of \$990.33 and this amount was transferred to the Custodian's office on September 17th, 1942. The Bank passbook was sent to Uemura on September 22nd, 1943.

The total funds standing to the credit of this Japanese person at June 22, 1945, were \$995.08 and of this amount a cheque for \$950.00 was forwarded to Uemura on this date, leaving a balance of \$45.08.

Under date of September 24th, 1945 a request to pay an old outstanding debt of \$25.00 to Dr. J.A. Smith was made (hitherto payment of this item was questioned by Uemura) and settlement of this debt has now been made.

The balance of \$20.08 is now being forwarded to this Evacuee and the account closed.

NO OTHER PERSONAL PROPERTY OF THE ABOVE JAPANESE PERSON IS REVEALED ON THIS FILE.







Received your above letter regarding the claim of Dr. J. A. Smith. At the time of my evacuation from Vancouver, I had not completely recovered from the nasal operation of which the fee was \$75.00. I had already paid \$50.00 of it, and it was mutually understood between the doctor and I that the balance was to be paid when I have fully recovered. Unfortunately, I was now or less forced by the R.C.M.P. to go to a road-camp, on short notice, although I still had a gage in my still bleeding nose. I have asked the R.C.M.P. to postpone my departure until I have fully recovered, but under the circumstances, at that time as you are fully aware, I was told it was impossible. I have also reported to the same party that there was a balance of the fee still unpaid and the reply to that was the government will take full responsibility concerning it. Therefore I went to the road-camp suffering as I was. While at camp, I had a doctor of Jasper attend me, and even at present I am going regularly to a doctor in Toronto city. The fees I have paid to these doctors were no more amounts. In my brief association with Dr. Smith, I have known him to be a gentleman in every respect. If you will kindly relate this matter to him, I know he will understand.
