



Replying to your Mr A. McAlister, also Mr Brown, we called on the above today, and he acknowledged the unpaid accounts as quoted in Mr A. McAlister's letter of June 3, 1944.

This Japanese contracted to work 8 acres of beets for one Mr Milner, Raymond, in 1944, which would net him approximately \$240.00.

He has no money at the present time, and since his earnings will be so small, it will be very difficult for him to pay the accounts in 1944. However, he does promise definitely to try to retire the accounts by the earliest date possible.
