GENERAL SUMMARY

Re: Susakichi INABA #09678

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on November 8, 1943, in which he stated that he owned no property in the protected area, but on the back of the J card he listed a quantity of chattels.

The chattels thus reported are handled on the file of his wife, Naha INABA, File 7923, as she was the only member of the family registered with this office when these chattels were received in Vancouver from Britannia Beach, where the INABA family had lived. The chattels appear to have been stored at Britannia Beach under the name and registration number of Mrs. INABA. The goods brought in to Vancouver were sold at auction on July 6, 1945, and the net proceeds of \$11.44 have been credited to the account of Mrs. INABA. On July 2, 1943, Susakichi INABA signed a Custodian Release asking for shipment of a trunk and a wooden box. In the absence of evidence to the contrary we assume that these articles were shipped.
