Dear Sir:

We have been advised by the Department of Labour, Japanese Division, that the above noted Japanese person died at Fort Osborne Barracks Hospital, Winnipeg, Manitoba, on February 13, 1945, and we are writing to request that you kindly undertake the administration of his Estate.

According to information on our files, Toichi TAKAGA, deceased, was a Japanese National of 50 years of age, and left his surviving the following:

Mrs. Nobuko TAKAGA, widow, aged 42; Japanese National.
Toshiroki TAKAGA, son, aged 19.
Joni TAKAGA, son, aged 9.

Mrs. Takaga and family are presently residing at 165 First Avenue, Hamilton, Ontario.

The only asset of the deceased, of which we have knowledge, is a credit balance with the Custodian, amounting to \$105.39 and a \$50.00 Dominion of Canada Victory Bond, which is being held in safe-keeping at this office.

Funeral expenses of this deceased amounted to \$105.00 and were paid from his account with the Custodian on March 22, 1945, at which time the credit balance of this account totalled \$205.14.

We have to acknowledge your letter of December 6, 1946.

Our file on this Internee reveals that a cheque for the sum of \$105.00 was mailed to your Department on March 22, 1945, to cover funeral expenses of the above deceased Prisoner of war. This cheque was returned to us by your Department with your letter of May 9, 1945, in which you state, in part,

"In this connection, it is desired to say that an account in respect to funeral expenses for \$75.00 has been received from Messrs. Horne Bros. Ltd., Winnipeg, which account it was our intention to pay against a credit balance presently held on behalf of this former Internee".

According to information received from the Internment Corp., the credit balance of this Internee, as of February 18, 1945, was \$75.01. According to our records, this balance was not remitted to this office and it was, therefore, assumed that it was applied against your portion of the funeral expenses. The cheque for \$105.00 was then forwarded to the Department of Labour to cover their portion of the funeral expenses.

We would appreciate hearing from you at your earliest convenience regarding this credit balance in order that we may advise the Official Administrator of its disposition when presenting the additional account for funeral expenses.

Re: Estate of Toichi TANAKA, Deceased,

We have to acknowledge your letter of December 16.

Our records indicate that on May 21, 1945, our cheque in the amount of \$105.00, payable to the Receiver General, was mailed to the Department of Labour, covering their recoverable Invoice No. 4270 which was submitted, together with authorization for payment from the widow and the bill of Mordus Bros. for \$110.86. This cheque has been acknowledged by the Department of Labour and we are assured that the money was actually paid over to Mordus Bros. We cannot account for the discrepancy between the amount claimed by the Department of Labour and the amount shown on the bill of Mordus Bros.

From a telephone conversation today with the Comptroller at the Department of Labour, it is learned that the charge of \$75.00 referred to by the Department of National Defence is an additional charge and is the proportion which is usually absorbed by that Department in the case of funerals of Interned persons. According to correspondence on the files of the Department of Labour, they had agreed with the Department of National Defence that the account should be issued in two parts, as above, and understood that the bill for \$75.00 would be paid by the Department of National Defence.

It is found from the list of Internee balances at the Internment Camp that the balance of this deceased Internee, Tanaka, as at February 28, 1945, amounted to \$72.01. There is no record whatsoever to indicate that this balance was remitted to this office and it would appear that this amount should have been applied against the funeral charge of \$75.00 if the Department of National Defence were not prepared to absorb the charge in this case. We are writing to them today with regard to this and will advise you further in this regard.
