We are informed that the marginally named pensioner was discharged from the Essondale Mental Hospital on June 15th, 1946 for repatriation to Japan and we believe, according to newspaper reports, that he may have already left by steamship for Japan.

We are interested in this case from a pension angle, . since he was in receipt of a permanent pension for G.S.W. Left Leg. assessed at 20% pension, amounting to \$15.00 per month, He was also in receipt of War Veterans' Allowance. Now from the pension angle our Head Office are anxious to determine the question of repatriation and the disposal of this pension monies. Do you know, if at the present time, monies can be sent from Canada to natives in Japan? If so what are the arrangements?

We note a request from Dr. Gee at Essendale that this man's pension cheque should be made payable to you. If this were the case what action would you take now, in view of this man's repatriation with his pension money. You will realize from this rembling memorandum that we are actually seaking information, trying to learn how to deal with this type of case. There may not be very many throughout the
