




MEMORANDUM

TO: THE FILE

RE: Kosho MATANO

Kosho MATANO was admitted to Essondale Mental Hospital some time during the year 1933 and for five years prior to that time resided in Powell River, B. C., according to information received by telephone today from Mr. J. H. Brown of the Department of Veterans Affairs. Mr. Brown also stated that MATANO was a veteran of World War I.

We also communicated by telephone with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police today and ascertained that this Japanese was repatriated to Japan on June 17, 1946, having left here on the S.S. General Meigs.
