Tsuya Nishimura died in the year 1936 at the age of nineteen years. He was survived by his parents, Jutaro and Shige Nishimura.

The only asset belonging to the deceased which has come to the attention of the Custodian was an account #N 1209 in the Japan and Canada Trust Savings Company. The Custodian learned of this in May 1942 when a letter was received from Massers. Notris & MacLennan requesting payment of the balance in the account, amounting to approximately \$58.16, to the parents of the deceased as partial payment of funeral expenses which they had paid. The matter was referred to Massers.

P. S. Ross and Sons, controllers of the Japan and Canada Trust Savings Company, and on July 13, 1942, the sum of \$69.67, being the balance in the account of the deceased, plus interest, was forwarded to this office in the form of a cheque made payable to Mr. and Mrs. Mishimura, jointly. This cheque was forwarded to Massers. Norris & MacLennan on August 3, 1942, and they acknowledged receipt on August 4, 1942.

No assets and no liabilities, other than those mentioned above, came to the attention of the Custodian.
