



In August, 1946 a Japanese by the name of T. Maikawa was employed by us fighting fire at Lemon Creek. A cheque was issued in his favour for payment of his services, but through an error in the Post Office this cheque was handed to the wrong man who forged the endorsement and cashed same.

We have since obtained a refund of the amount from the Bank, but in the meantime Maikawa has been evacuated to Japan and he has written us asking for his money, and giving us his full address. Would you please advise us what steps we should take to forward him the amount due.



Our records show that Tomiharu MAIKAWA, Registration Number 17692 was repatriated to Japan on October 2, 1946 and at that date he had just recently turned 16 years of age, so if you can let us know the given name of the T. Maikawa in question we will be able to correctly identify him and pay the money through the Dominion Government Treasury Department in the correct manner.
