Would you be good enough to have your office write to Mr. K. Kimura who, we believe, lives at Christina Lake, regarding the following matters in connection with the above mentioned company.

Munro Calculator - When Mr. Kimura left Vancouver he took with him a Munro Calculator and so far it has not been returned to us. This, we think, should be shipped by Mr. Kimura and failing that we suggest that he might be advised that his account will be debited with an amount of \$100.00.

Salt Salmon Packers Association - In our report to you we mentioned that while this association had wound up that we understood it had sufficient funds on hand to pay its account owing to Canadian Salt Herring Exporters Limited of \$99.43. We believe that Mr. Kimura will have knowledge of who would be in possession of these funds and possible you would ask him this also.

The outstanding liabilities of Canadian Salt Herring Exporters Limited, excluding the capital advances made by the various packing companies, amount to \$2,452.96 and are as follows:

We have on hand in cash and bonds sufficient money to almost pay these accounts in full but suggest that in the meantime a dividend of 75¢ on the dollar should be paid. In order to make this payment it would be necessary for us to dispose of Victory Loan on hand in the amount of \$1,600.00. We would like to have your approval of this action on our part.
