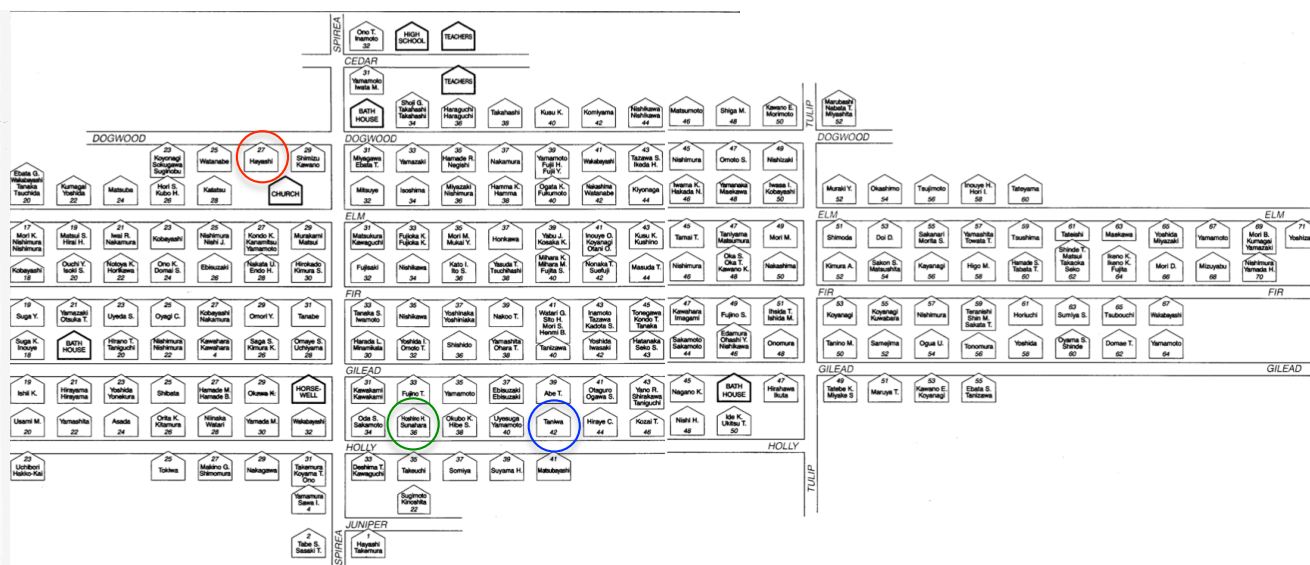
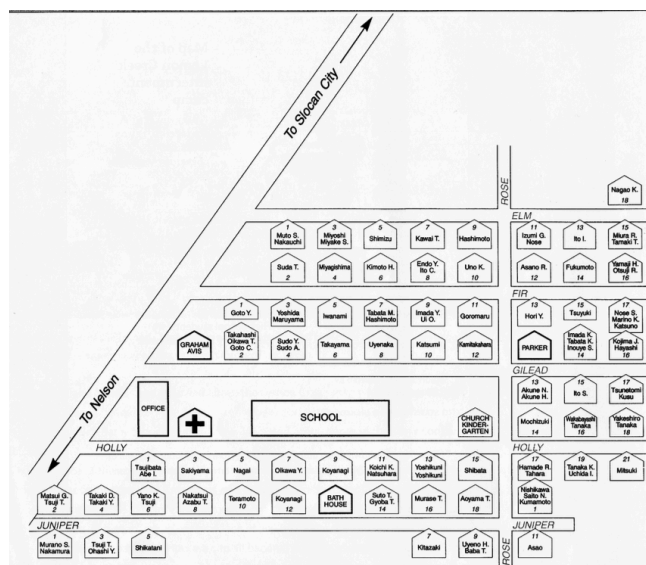

I recieved your letter Dated 17th October 1950,
connecting with ① my two gramophones and ② rema-
ining goods, enclosing ③ a "Complete statement."

In regard above mentioned I would like to
write following propose to beg your consideration.

① The two gramophones, One of this machine
was mahogany finished 3 feet high cost \$55.00 1935.
Other one was common gramophone cost \$26.50 1929.
both are kept in west room and north room of
upstairs my old residence at Steveston, B.C.

I had recieved 1 electorict gramophone
and other chattels from my neighbors Mr. W.A.
Urquhart witch I had deposited him before
evacuation.

But this machine and other chattels are
clearly nothing connecting with that two

gramaphones or other goods witch you had (auction sold)

In this matter I wish you this debit balance should be cancellation.

② I had letter from your office March of 1948, about my remaining goods, and I wrote your office immediately, expecting there are picture of my Father and friends etc. and waited your answer, 2 years and seven months in vain.

If there are nothing belonging to me, will you kindly let me know who lost it in what kind of reasons.

③ I am very surprising to see this "complete statement" containing many of unsatisfactory points, expecting your reply immediately
